Statutory Declarations Act 1959

A statutory declaration under the *Statutory Declarations Act* 1959 may be made before:

- 1. person who is currently licensed or registered under a law to practise in one of the following occupations:
 - o Chiropractor
 - o Dentist
 - o Legal practitioner
 - o Medical practitioner
 - o Nurse
 - o Optometrist
 - o Patent attorney
 - o Pharmacist
 - o Physiotherapist
 - o Psychologist
 - Trade marks attorney
 - o Veterinary surgeon
- 2. a person who is enrolled on the roll of the Supreme Court of a State or Territory, or the High Court of Australia, as a legal practitioner (however described); or
- 3. a person who is in the following list:
 - Agent of the Australian Postal Corporation who is in charge of an office supplying postal services to the public
 - Australian Consular Officer or Australian Diplomatic Officer (within the meaning of the Consular Fees Act 1955)
 - o Bailiff
 - $\circ~$ Bank officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
 - \circ Building society officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
 - $\circ~$ Chief executive officer of a Commonwealth court
 - Clerk of a court
 - o Commissioner for Affidavits
 - Commissioner for Declarations
 - $\,\circ\,$ Credit union officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
 - $\circ~$ Employee of the Australian Trade Commission who is:
 - in a country or place outside Australia; and
 - authorised under paragraph 3 (d) of the Consular Fees Act 1955; and
 - exercising his or her function in that place
 - Employee of the Commonwealth who is:
 - in a country or place outside Australia; and
 - authorised under paragraph 3 (c) of the Consular Fees Act 1955; and
 - exercising his or her function in that place
 - o Fellow of the National Tax Accountants' Association
 - $\,\circ\,$ Finance company officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
 - \circ Holder of a statutory office not specified in another item in this list
 - Judge of a court
 - o Justice of the Peace
 - o Magistrate
 - o Marriage celebrant registered under Subdivision C of Division 1 of Part IV of the Marriage Act 1961
 - Master of a court
 - o Member of Chartered Secretaries Australia
 - $\circ\,$ Member of Engineers Australia, other than at the grade of student
 - $\circ\,$ Member of the Association of Taxation and Management Accountants
 - $\circ~$ Member of the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy

Statutory Declarations Act 1959

- Member of the Australian Defence Force who is:
 - $\circ~$ an officer; or
 - a non-commissioned officer within the meaning of the *Defence Force Discipline Act* 1982 with 5 or more years of continuous service; or
 - $\circ\;$ a warrant officer within the meaning of that Act
- Member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia, the Australian Society of Certified Practising Accountants or the National Institute of Accountants

- \circ the Parliament of the Commonwealth; or
- \circ the Parliament of a State; or
- o a Territory legislature; or
- o a local government authority of a State or Territory
- Minister of religion registered under Subdivision A of Division 1 of Part IV of the Marriage Act 1961

- Permanent employee of the Australian Postal Corporation with 5 or more years of continuous service who is employed in an office supplying postal services to the public

 - the Commonwealth or a Commonwealth authority; or
 - a State or Territory or a State or Territory authority; or

 - with 5 or more years of continuous service who is not specified in another item in this list
- Person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the law of the State or Territory in which the declaration is made
- Police officer

- Senior Executive Service employee of:
 - the Commonwealth or a Commonwealth authority; or
 - a State or Territory or a State or Territory authority
- o Sheriff
- o Sheriff's officer
